

# MCAS Miramar Motorcycle Range

## Application and Policies

**Note: MCAS Miramar Safety Department Motorcycle Training will always have priority use of the Motorcycle Range.**

1. How to schedule the use of Motorcycle range.
  - a. Submit the below by email to Mr. Matthew McMullen - [matthew.d.mcmullen@usmc.mil](mailto:matthew.d.mcmullen@usmc.mil) and Carbon Copy (CC) Mr. Jeremy Jensen – [jeremy.jensen1@usmc.mil](mailto:jeremy.jensen1@usmc.mil) :
    - i. Motorcycle range use checkout sheet with signature.
    - ii. Risk Assessment required to be filled out and submitted with the checkout sheet.
    - iii. Roster of all Participants to include SNCO or OIC requesting use.
2. Motorcycle range time is 0730 to 1530 each day. Just follow the training on the Safety calendar for available times. Safety Calendar link: <https://eis.usmc.mil/sites/mcasm2/SAFETY/default.aspx>
3. On the day before scheduled use SNCOIC or OIC who scheduled the range will show at building 6022 to receive head key and code to gate for motorcycle range. If range has been scheduled on a weekend they will show the Friday before the weekend to receive the key and code.
4. Range rules and regulations:
  - a. Motorcycles must be inspected for safe riding (T-CLOCS).
  - b. A SNCO or OIC must be present while range is in use.
  - c. All PPE will be required and utilized while riding motorcycle to include eye protection.
  - d. Must have valid motorcycle license and have completed BRC to ride on range. No unlicensed riders.
  - e. Max speed on range not to exceed 30 MPH.
  - f. No modifications to range of any kind.
  - g. No markings of any kind or any adjustment to the motorcycle range (no painting, chalk, etc.).
  - h. No training on inclement weather days which includes but not limited to: rain, too hot (black flag), or electrical storms.
  - i. Riding mentorship and practice only. No formal MSF/CSMP training.
  - j. Motorcycle range limit is 6 riders and at least 1 Mentor or Motorcycle Club President to provide guidance in order to ensure safety of operations. All other personnel may have bikes parked off motorcycle range and wait to be rotated onto range by Mentor. At no point will more than 6 personnel be riding on the motorcycle range at one time.
  - k. Only Motorcycles will be allowed beyond barriers. Cars, trucks, etc. will remain outside the range at all times.
  - l. Head (restroom) and Motorcycle Range cleanup will be conducted at end of use.
5. SNCOIC or OIC that scheduled the range will secure both heads and motorcycle range gate after use. Head key will be dropped off at building 6022.
6. Emergencies: Call 911 Site Address is BLDG 6650.
